2. Finance Report & User Fees (McGowan)

1. Participation

- a. McGowan notes that participation is slightly down this year, but revenue is up because of the fee increase, as well as a small payment from NPS for development of new layers for data from Tuzigoot & Montezuma Castle National Monuments
- b. The total amount invoiced for calendar year 2025 accounts is \$263,940, up from \$233,555 for calendar year 2024 accounts
- 2. University of Arizona Financials FY25 End of Year
 - a. Beginning balance: \$0
 - i. Excluding \$133,719 carryforward from FY24 frozen by UA
 - b. Total income: \$260,895
 - i. Excluding \$165,158 transfer from UA UITS
 - c. Total expense and transfers \$170,310
 - i. Excludes remaining encumbrance on FY25 ASU Hosting and Maintenance PO (\$23K)
 - d. Annual balance: \$90,585

 - i. Walsh asked if we could find a way to spend money being frozen by UA before it is frozen. We need to use our money for our projects, and spend it on our projects
 - ii. Watson notes that the freeze of FY24 carryforward had been understood to be a one-time action, and the freeze of FY25 carryforward was not expected. ASM is working to reclassify AZSITE's account within the UA system to prevent this in the future.
 - iii. Walsh proposes new business for next meeting to identify projects for any potential FY26 carryforward balance to be spent on
 - d. Encumbrances: (\$161,636)
 - i. Excludes remaining encumbrance for FY25 ASU PO (\$23K)
 - e. Cash Expenditure Authority: (\$195,212)
- 4. Fiscal Year 2026 Budget Projected vs Actuals

- a. Personnel costs: \$179,976 projected; \$178,115 actual/remaining projected.
- b. Operations costs: \$47,775 projected; \$46,159 actual/remaining projected.

5. FY26 Budget

- a. Gabe notes that UA has said they will not charge IDC fees of 2% on expenditures and UA 11% on income this year.
- b. Total projected spending with these fees included was about \$261,000; without them, it is around \$228,000.
- 6. AZSITE User Applications and Billing and AZSITE User Fees (Table 1 and Table 6)
 - a. Gabe notes that we are in a position to possibly reduce fees, to avoid freeze of any FY carryforward. Mapping our calendar year 2025 payments back to the 2024 fee structure yields around \$228,000 in revenue. Alternatively, we can try and allocate that money on additional projects.
 - b. Chris notes that outside of projects, charging the fees at the beginning calendar year causes issues with the budget, as they are mismatched. Is there any way to do fees on a fiscal year rather than calendar year?
 - i. Watson notes that is not really possible
 - ii. Chris asks if ongoing projects with funds are also frozen. Is there a way to encumber funding to cross the fiscal year so they can't sweep it?
 - iii. Watson notes that it is something we should look into. But the real issue is finding things to encumber. He did not anticipate freezing and sweeping accounts would happen again, and that action needs to be taken to anticipate this again and will reach out to Rocha for guidance on that
 - c. Gabe states that in terms of money we need, our budget for this fiscal year looks to be close to 230,000 however the ArcGIS Enterprise Migration could go over budget, which wouldn't be surprising. The project costs seem to have been estimated quite low and the project been a slow process to get moving.
 - d. Watson proposes that we add Reducing Fees as a topic for next meeting

3. Funding Opportunity (Walsh)

Florence Copper Project Funding

1. Walsh discusses that the money is for a database, SHPO and ASLD have discussed that money go to AZSITE. We are waiting on approval from the EPA still. Additionally, Florence Copper may have more funds from the next phase of their projects. However, that money cannot be given to AZSITE if it is just going to be frozen by the UA. We want to money to remain there, with AZSITE. Hopefully by the next meeting we will have that funded.

 - i. NPS provided data from Tuzigoot and Montezuma Castle
 - ii. ADOT provided new reference data, other data to come as well
 - iii. Tumamoc Hill research group provided a geodatabase to be shared in AZSITE it is an extremely detailed dataset for a small area and likely would require its own application.


