B	Boosters Maps	Several maps of the Phoenix area created in late 19th-early 20th century to boost tourism and growth, based on possibilities for irrigation and attractions of history; considered by many to be inaccurate

BLM	Bureau of Land Management	Ex: x:##:##(BLM); site; see also AR above

GP	Gila Pueblo	Ex: x:##:##(GP). Different grid from ASM system; Gila Pueblo Arch'l Foundation started 1928 by Harold Gladwin; did work all over American SW; Emil Hauray was Asst Director 1930; defined Hohokam and Cochise cultures for first time; dissolved 1950; collection donated to ASM; buildings now part of Gila Community College, Globe; on National Register
I	SHPO Inventory number	Ex: ####-I; normally indicates a survey. If associated with a report number ####-R, the survey identified a site, otherwise an I number indicates a no-findings survey.
IF-#	Isolated Find	Cf ACS project on Cleator quad
H	Hemenway Expedition	Mary T Hemenway funded 1st major scientific archaeological expedition to SW, starting 1886 with Frank H. Cushing, Director. He was replaced due to illness with Jesse Walter Fewkes, 1889. Continued until death of Hemenway in 1894. Maps by F.W. Hodge and C. Garlick; no final report ever written. Materials in collections at Harvard's Peabody Museum, Huntington Library (Calif), Brooklyn (NY) Museum, Smithsonian Inst., and Southwest Museum (Los Angeles CA)
HUIR or HIR	Hualapai Indian Reservation	Reference sites on Hualapai Reservation; cf Frazier Wells quad; these locations are restricted and not visible through AZSITE.
JH	Jerry Howard	Mostly in Mesa area

MC	Frank Midvale	Midvale canals

N	Laura Nicholas	Used new analytical techniques, including aerial photointerpretation, for new maps of prehistoric canals, 1980's

NAR	Northland Anthropological Research, Inc.	Ex: ##-NAR, referenced in L. Stone's 1983 Maricopa County Inventory - became Northland Research Inc in 1981

NRI	Northland Research, Inc.	Ex: x:##:##(NRI); site
P or Patrick	Herbert R. Patrick	Professional surveyor & cartographer in Phoenix; began detailed notes on canals & sites in 1878, published Patrick Map in 1903 (Phoenix Free Museum Bulletin No. 1). Died 1924
P + T		on Howard map (Phoenix quad); maybe only on canals; probably Patrick & Turney
PMDR	Plateau Mountain Desert Research, Flagstaff	Ex: x:##:##(PMDR); site
PG / PGM	Pueblo Grande	Ex: x:##:##(PG); site
R	SHPO report number	Ex: ####-R, always with an ####-I for inventory (survey) that preceded the report
REC	RECON site	Ex: AZ T:8:3(REC) on Hedgpeth Hills quad; from RECON Stetson Hills Survey (Regional Environmental Consultants, San Diego)
S	Albert Schroeder	1914-1993; pioneering work in Hohokam cultural studies
SHPO	State Historic Preservation Office	####.SHPO is SHPO project number; ##-I is SHPO inventory number (survey with no findings; ##-R is SHPO report number (report after something is found)
SIU	Southern Illinois University	Ex: x:##:##(SIU); site
SN	ASM sites in Sonora, Mexico	Ex: SN X:##.##(ASM); site
T	Omar Turney	Phoenix City Engineer, 1920's+, 1929 article "Prehistoric Irrigation" in <i>AZ Historical Review</i> ; famous for canal studies and irrigation & site maps; died 1929
T + N	Turney & Nicholas	Turney & Nicholas
T-#	Tower	Possible tower location if along powerline corridor

Tompkin Map	Tompkin, associate of Frank Midvale	Associate of Frank Midvale who did a map of the immediate area for him; Tomkin map is in the portion of the Midvale collection housed at ASU. See Fowler quad, near Los Aumentos.
##-## or ####	Possible ASM project number; or possible Forest Svc number	No other designation; many around Tucson area; check to see if you are in a Nat'l Forest area
### or ####	Black Book reference	Black Book in SHPO Library; concordance list of sites; often seen next to a site number
#####	Little Colorado River MRA	5 digit numbers within the Little Colorado River Multiple Resource Area; ref: C Hoffman, 1981, Little Colorado MRA at SHPO; check to see if you are in northeastern AZ, not in Nat'l Forest area
	Other notes	There are several notations used in Bureau of Reclamation surveys: TB###, PB###, M## (may be Midvale numbers), AVID# (Avra Valley Irrigation District), AP-###-MT2 (on Newman Peak quad), NMID# (North Magma Irrigation District), FL# on Sawik Mountain quad (part of Granite Reef Aqueduct project)
