Meetings

AHAC has met once following the last AZSITE Executive Board Meeting in April 2022. Our July 8, 2022 committee meeting was again held via zoom. The meeting focused on a review of upcoming AZSITE attribute search interface improvement and strategizing development of the AZSITE user training module.

Committee Membership

The Ad Hoc Advisory Committee is approaching its two-year anniversary, and the appointment of several charter members will expire on August 26, 2022 —Ian Milliken, Mark Reavis, and Tina Thompson. These charter members have played a significant role in the Committee, and if they are willing to serve a second term, and if the Board supports their continued service, the Committee Chair will request that they serve another two-year term, expiring in August 2024.

Likewise, Dan Garcia has served as Chair of the Committee for two years, and intends to step down as Chair of the Committee. The Committee will meet in September/October to elect a new Chair.
